THE TOWN MAYOR'S NEW YEAR MESSAGE

After an exciting 2012 we now look forward to 2013 and a very Happy New Year to all. This year promises to be another full year for the Town Council as it collates feedback from the Housing Needs Survey and continues to pursue its ambition to provide some affordable housing in the Town for local people.

The Town Council is in discussions with Waveney District Council about the disinvestment, from WDC, of former Southwold assets which were transferred to the District Council more than 40 years ago; it would be good to return these to the Town's control, much as has been done with the putting green and the Klondyke. The Town Council must, however, guard against increasing its financial liabilities and the policy remains, that any transfers should have a cost neutral effect on the Town finances.

More good news is that the rebuilding of *Ladies' Walk* is due to commence during 2013 and it will be fantastic to see this popular part of the promenade return to use.

The Town will also be commemorating the 60th anniversary of the East Coast floods at a special church service on the evening of Wednesday 30th January [details on page 2] and we hope that there will be a large turnout on this evening.
